Dear Litigation Team (on behalf of your client, Mr [REDACTED])

Thank you for your letter of 12 February 2021.

We have looked into the history in as much as we are able to, to respond to the matters raised in your letter. We have had sight of the letter dated 24 March 2016, but none of the other documents to which you refer.

Our records show that at the hearing on 12 December 2013, the Learned Judge granted the forfeiture order in principle in relation to the property held by City of London Police, including, computers. However, this was subject to the provision of a schedule, within 56 days, to specify the items in relation to which the Order was being sought. We cannot find a record of whether the said schedule was submitted and would suggest that you make further enquiries with City of London Police.

The property has at no time been held by the CPS. We therefore suggest that you refer your request for its return directly to City of London Police legal department.
